## Partner's History/Relationship with the Project:

The Evangelical Congregational Church in Angola (IECA) is a longstanding partner of Global Ministries, founded in 1880. Since its beginnings, IECA is committed to be an agent of change, prioritizing social development. Improvements have been made in the lives of many people through projects of rehabilitation, education, training, literacy, health, peace, and reconciliation.

Angola was ravaged by a 27-year civil war, which devastated its people. The church's commitment to peace and reconciliation was in the forefront in the post-war days. Many of Angola's people still suffer from extreme poverty, malnutrition, disease, and hunger, and there is a lack of hospitals and schools as a result of the war. Many rural Angolans fled to the coast or to refugee camps during the war, but these areas had harsh living conditions and lacked opportunities for education and basic services. Basic skills and many opportunities for improvement were not available for nearly two generations of Angolans.

The Church is guided by two areas: spiritual and social development. Spiritual development is run through the Christian education and evangelism department, while social development takes place through the IECA's Department of Social Assistance, Studies and Projects (DASEP). Activities of the DASEP include implementing sustainable development programs in the areas of agriculture food security, income generation, literacy, maternal care and nutrition, human rights and community organizing, water and sanitation, and community infrastructure (schools and health clinics).

## **Description of Project**

According to Angola's National Institute of Statistics, the Huambo province has one of the highest unemployment rates in the country. In addition to a harsh economic reality for many, in Angolan society, there is a wide gap between men and women in terms of income and access to services, housing, land, and even micro-loands. In order to improve the income for families in the Huambo province of Angola, IECA is beginning a project to train 180 young adults with vocational skills, including tailoring, catering, and pastry making. This will help young adults in finding jobs and earning a fair wage.

According to the Provincial Department of Statistics and Planning, Huambo is a highly populated province with 1,948,000 people (approximately 15% of the estimated national of 12.6 million). More than half of the population

is conctrated in two cities: Huambo city (822,000 people) and Caála (239,000 people). Also, approximately 22% of the population are children under five years of age.

The Evangelical Congregational Church in Angola has a center of professional training in Huambo City. Therefore, this project will increase the number of young adults receiving vocational training and have the opportunity to grow professionally.

## Target Population (children, women, farmers, urban poor, etc.):

The target population will be the most vulnerable young adults, primarily women, in Huambo city.

### How many persons are/will be served? (please give as specific a figure as possible)?

This project will provide vocational training for 180 young adults at the IECA vocational training center, divided into two groups. One group will meet in the morning and one group will meet in the afternoon for a three-month program.

#### **Key Objectives:**

The overall objective of the project is to empower young adults with life skills and vocational skills that will promote self-reliance and job creation.

Specifically, the objective of the project is to train young adults in the trades of catering, pastry making, and tailoring.

#### **Key Activities:**

- 1. Contract instructors for tailoring, catering, and pastry making courses
- 2. Select 180 young adults (primarily women) from local IECA churches and the community for these new courses
- 3. Purchase equipment and supplies
- 4. Provide the courses to 180 participants

One year
