

Global Mission Intern Program

October 2018—April 2019

The Global Mission Intern (GMI) Program continues as an exciting and innovative leadership program in the church. As we witness young people who have moved through this program transition to leadership roles across the church, we are now adding on to each biography of the concluding GMI some brief information about their next plans. Our cohorts of GMIs together are creating a new generation of future leaders. The Mission Personnel Office continues to do outreach across the country in various Disciple institutions sharing about the partnership between Week of Compassion and Global Ministries. This summer, for the first time, many Global Mission Interns will be visiting Disciples camps as chaplains, counselors and resource people sharing the exciting news with youth across the country.

We are in the fourth year where GMIs participate, as their terms conclude, in a local placement following their service that is coordinated with the Disciple and UCC Volunteer offices for 3 months – 1 year tailored to correspond to their responsibilities in their international location of service. This allows them to itinerate in our churches for a longer period, provides a transition space for the interns and does not affect the bottom line of the GMI program as it is done in coordination with the Partners in Service program who cover the interns' stipend and health insurance during this window.

There are eight global mission interns are currently serving, who have been processed or who are itinerating during this period with one who concluded in this window between October and April. The new large cohort to be approved and commissioned during May and June, trained in August and sent in September, will be presented in the October report.



Kearstin Bailey (10/1/17 – 7/31/19) Member of David's United Church of Christ, Akron, Ohio, completed her service with the refugee resettlement project of the Perichoresis of the Evangelical Church of Greece. She is now serving with the refugee ministries of the United Church of Christ for her Partners in Service placement, will then be serving in camps across Nebraska, Kentucky, Iowa and New Hampshire followed by starting seminary at Brite in the fall.

Danielle Lee (10/1/18 – 9/30/19) Member of Walking Faith Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Sunnyvale, California. Danielle was scheduled for service with the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea. Her assignment is working with the ecumenical office and also with My Sister's Place, a PROK program to address human trafficking. Danielle's placement has been complicated by two family deaths and new visa regulations in Korea.



Cara McKinney (11/1/17 – 5/31/19) Member of Disciples Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Cleveland, Ohio, completed her service with at Melel Xojobal, a center for children’s advocacy in Chiapas, Mexico. Cara was the young adult educator working with teenagers and specifically young women on health education. She is now in her Partners in Service placement working with at the UCC offices in Cleveland doing outreach for global mission churches and vacation Bible school curriculum development. She will be attending an MPH program in Boston this fall.



Nia Sullivan (9/1/17 – 7/31/19) Member of First Christian Church, Reidsville, North Carolina, completed her service now with the Council of Churches of Sierra Leone. Nia served with the Council’ Girls Access to Education (GATE) program that focuses on empowerment of young women. She is going to be attending camps and conferences this summer in Ohio, Bethany Beach, Upper Midwest, and Christmount. In the fall she will be going to graduate school in gender studies in Finland.

Ha-un Priscilla Yang (10/1/17 – 9/30/19) Member of First Christian Church of North Hollywood, Studio City, California, continues her service for a second year with Reformed Church in Hungary. Priscilla works with the Ecumenical Office of the Church, and does outreach and youth work with the Roman ministry and the Refugee ministry. She has been involved this spring with solidarity trips to Italy, Jordan and Syria for other Protestant communions addressing the refugee crisis.



Joanines Adorno-Díaz (10/1/17 – 12/31/18) Member of Casa del Alfarero (Disciples of Christ), Indianapolis, Indiana, concluded her service with the Church of North India, Durgapur Diocese in Durgapur, India, as liaison with the anti-human trafficking program of the Diocese of Durgapur. She itinerated in the Indiana region and is now working in the Disciples Center with the Hope Partnership office.



Emmanuela Loccident-Joseph (10/1/17 – 12/31/18) Member of Église Pentecôte Missionnaire de Prières, Laval, Quebec, Canada. Emmanuela concluded her service with the Evangelical Church in Morocco, based in Oujda. Emmanuela is a Research and Communications Associate for the national church. Emmanuela transitioned on January 1, 2019 to a fully supported mission co-worker with a three year contract to continue this important work with communication and outreach on the refugee assistance and other ministries of the Evangelical Church in Morocco. Emmanuela will be visiting camps in Tennessee, Indiana and Michigan this summer.

New Global Mission Intern:

Fiyori Kidane (9/1/19 – 8/31/20) Member of Allisonville Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Indianapolis, Indiana, Fiyori has been approved during this period to begin her service with the refugee resettlement project of the Perichoresis of the Evangelical Church of Greece. She will do an initial visa and placement trip in June, be commissioned at Assembly and begin her official service in September.
