Partner's History/Relationship with the Project:

Established in the early 1950's the Department of Service for Palestinian Refugees was organized to aid Palestinian refugees with their newly acquired status following the 1948 Arab-Israeli war. DSPR advocates for Palestinian rights and works to improve the quality of life for the innumerable Palestinians who live in the refugee camps in Gaza, Jerusalem, the West Bank, Galilee, and also in Jordan and Lebanon.

International Christian Committee (ICC)'s historic experience in agriculture through community-based relationships remains. This network of relationships within Palestinian communities and with relevant official bodies enables the DSPR and ICC to help mitigate rural community hardships by enhancing individual skills in agriculture and investing in their knowledge to strengthen project sustainability in a context that is becoming more dependent on outside aid.

One of DSPR's strategic directions is to enhance rural communities through agriculture. Agriculture remains the largest sector of the Palestinian economy, generating 22-30% of the GDP of the West Bank and Gaza and providing employment to over 15% of the population. Presently, Palestinian agriculture is far from flourishing. The Palestinian agricultural sector is faced with high competition with subsidized Israeli agriculture, unfair trade laws allowing subsidized Israeli produce into the territories while restricting Palestinian markets in Israel, the high costs of production and labor, the rapidly rising cost of living in the region, and a lack of sufficient research to help farmers improve their production and efficiency. Additionally, due to recent severe measures taken by the Israeli leadership, available work permits for Palestinians were reduced by 100,000 leaving these individuals unemployed and seeking ways to regain a source of income.

The DSPR and ICC have managed this project for two full years. In those two years they have worked with those living in the villages in area "C" contributing to their resilience through sustainable agriculture. The DSPR and ICC have assisted those living in the villages in distributing 60,000 seedlings, setting up five greenhouses and irrigation systems, preparing land, and providing onsite training by an agronomist. The villages have been successful in growing five different varieties of herbs that they plan to process in a small local factory drying, packaging, and marketing.

DSPR and ICC now want to help the community finish the production cycle by helping Al Aqaba village procure a packaging machine, which is necessary to prepare the product for local and external markets.

Description of Project

Name of Project (agricultural, health, water, micro-credit, education, community development, etc.):

The Sustainable Agriculture and Community Resilience project is addressing United Nations Sustainable Development Goal number two: to improve food security and enhance agriculture sustainability.

This project aims to aid the village of Al-Aqaba by helping to provide a packaging machine for their processing and production

factory so that their herbs can be marketed locally and in neighboring countries. An agronomist will be available on site to accompany farmers in the production of herbs, delivery to the factory, documenting of yield, as well as training in marketing and e-marketing of their product. The overall long-term goal of this project is to enhance community resilience in the Aqaba/Tubas area through sustainable agriculture.

Target Population (children, women, farmers, urban poor, etc.):

This project will directly benefit 180 people as outlined below and will provide improvement for the village's population of 760 people. The project is inclusive of men, women, and children, as the farming culture of the region includes participation from all family members, which is similar to the olive harvesting culture of the region. The Village of Aqaba is located in the Jordan Valley of the West Bank.

- Procuring a packaging machine to enhance sales in local and external markets for herbal production
- Utilize the knowledge and training of the agronomist to market packaged materials locally and externally

The DSPR and ICC estimate it will take six months to obtain the packaging machine and implement it in the production cycle.
