At ACT Ukraine Forum last week, many new staff were present among our partners. Which means in some places now, WOC carries the institutional memory of relationships and how we work together. Brings us a bigger role in some of these spaces. Means our staff is constantly putting mechanisms in place to do this work more effectively, and in best partnership.

- Review 2022 and YTD Financials John Goebel, VP of Finance
 - Primary increase in 2022 was designated (Ukraine) response
 - o Endowments (church and individual) doubled in 2022
 - Undesignated increased as well (up \$50k)
 - o 2023 distributions are above last year, with a good surplus to date

Break

- Christian Church Foundation and <u>WoC Endowment</u> Gary Kidwell, President of Christian Church Foundation
 - CCF donors' first beneficiary is their congregation. 2nd most common is WOC.
 - 261 permanent funds valued at \$7M-plus; distributing about \$700,000 in 2022 to WOC.
 - Ministries that have pivoted their funding are ministries that survive. That said, we
 - can't assume that generosity will continue it thrives because we tell good stories and do impactful mission.
 - Constantly increasing distributions are due both to the good management and steady
 - management of the funds AND to the fact that the number of funds has increased
 - (perhaps doubled) over the last decade.

 - Congo Social / Psychological Support for youth in prison with SEPPRODIA -\$12,000
 - SD team asks to fund at full amount
 - India Girls Leadership and Learning \$11,280

 - Sierra Leone and Liberia West Africa Initiative with Agriculture Missions Girls' education - \$22,500
 - SD team asks team to fund at full amount
