### **SECTION 2: Project Summary**

### **Project Goal**

Referring back to your original proposal, what is the overall goal of the project? If your plans have changed from the original proposal, please describe.

The Impaphala Congregational Church of the UCCSA – South Africa Synod was founded in 1901 by American Board of Foreign Missionaries, a predecessor missionary body of what is today Global Ministries. The UCCSA is divided into regional councils, composed of ministers and lay leaders to form synods in Botswana, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, and Zimbabwe. The church is deeply committed to ecumenical endeavors.

The Impaphala Congregational Church has been a central location for pastors and church leaders to receive training. The church council has decided to partner with local organizations to provide training and opportunities for church members to become more financially sustainable. Currently, the church has started working with the Sisingatha Impumelelo project and the South African Youth Climate Change Coalition. The Sisingatha Impumelelo project will provide training, long-term employment, and skill development for women in the region on egg production. The South African Youth Climate Change Coalition will develop youth and young adults in leadership training on climate change solutions.

Sisingatha Impumelelo is a 100% black-owned organization to offer an opportunity for South Africans from disadvantaged backgrounds on sustainable egg production and agricultural business. The South African Youth Climate Change Coalition (SAYCCC) is a network of young environmentalist and climate justice activists.

Through the agricultural training, the participants find empowerment through skill development and financial liberation. Through the young adult climate change leadership training portion of this project, participants learn about climate adaptation, introduction of climate policy, ways to raise awareness on climate change to establish a sense of urgency – specifically around agriculture, and increase the commitment and action of the community toward conserving the environment.

### **Activities related to Agriculture: Poultry Project**

Through the congregation's partnership with Sisingatha Impumelelo, the church has been able to procure 100 egg layers. The hens were bought in phases so as to allow them to lay eggs continually and to mature at different stages. The project is going well and there is reliable market where eggs are being purchased. The project is now self-sustaining and has generated some profits. Through the project, the women and young people are learning how to take care of the chickens. The Department of Agriculture has been instrumental for the project in providing expertise for participants on the poultry industry. Pictures of this project are included below, and the following purchases were required for this project:

### **Activities related to Education and Youth Development**

- Capacity buildings Workshops:
   In partnership with South African Youth Climate Change Coalition (SAYCCC) Workshop was attended and awareness campaigns on Climate change were held.
- Training of new youth leadership committee:

  The newly elected Youth Committee needed assistance in organizing, communication, and roles of the different committee members/ office bearers. Therefore, the church provided training sessions on governance and administrative skills for the new youth committee.
- Youth Camp
- Designing informational materials on Gender based violence and racism/xenophobia
- New Christian Educational Materials and Sunday School Materials created:
   The church prepared and purchased Christian education materials related to creation care.
   Additionally, the Impaphala Children's ministry visited the Enseleni Nature Reserve where the children learned about the work of the Nature Reserve and learned about different animals and plants found there. The congregation shares this was an informative visit and some of the children learned and saw new animals that they had never seen before in real life.
- Go to Grow Youth Initiative:
  - The congregation began a new youth initiative in partnership with One life Church and Mt Zion Church. The "Grow to Go" initiative is intended to help young people discover how they can work of justice, peace, love, reconciliation, and healing. The GTG is now a community of learning and faith. Some students describe the GTG as a transforming experience, and the church intends to continue supporting this program in the following areas:
    - To support youth development, in order to assist young people in becoming well-informed and active in relation to climate justice.
      - Enable more young people to participate in God's mission.
      - Deepen the understanding of personal identity and accountability.

• The Grow to Go Initiative and Youth Camp attracted a lot of young people in the KwaZulu Natal Region. This first event in June 2019, prior to this grant, had more than 70

participants. The Youth Committee was unsure how to continue hosting such a large crowd, financially. In December, following the grant's approval, the second event was promoted as a regional event and drew in an even larger crowd. The Youth Committee is grateful for this support and helping to make this youth program a success.
